Remember to plan enough time for photographs, although there will be plenty of time later for capturing wonderful unplanned moments, there should be plenty of time for planned photos! Every wedding I shoot gets full coverage, no time limit, no photo limit.

What does the photographer need to know?

When and where:

Are bride and groom are getting ready?

Is the service taking place?

Is the reception taking place?

Would you like to have portraits taken?

Ask the wedding coordinator of the church where the photographer may be during the service.

Planning ahead:

Make sure your family and friends know when and where the "family portraits" will take place so that there won't be a "roundup" making it difficult to take the photos.

**After the wedding give at least two weeks for processing.
If you would like a photo book please give another week for the creation of the book.**

Photograph Care

**All images will be stored on several DVD disks.
Remember to make multiple copies on archival disks for backup
and keep in a dry, dark and safe place.**

Do not store prints in direct sunlight, sunlight will fade even the best prints.

All wedding photographs are kept in my archive for permanent storage.
